

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
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The Concept of Covenant Objectives


Did you know that God's Will, the Word of God, is a Covenant? In this module we will learn about the concept of covenants. Objectives for this lesson include:

- Define Covenant Relationship
- Interpret Word Meanings in the Bible in the Hebrew and Greek
- Illustrate the Will of God, the Word of God
- Compare Human Relationships with our Covenant Relationship with God
- Assess Covenant Relationship with God
- Choose Covenant Relationship with God





The Concept of Covenant is the first lesson of ten in the series No Other Gods.



COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will enable the student to take a critical look at the parallel between Old Testament and present-day idolatry. Students will study: the central importance of idolatry in God's Covenant relationship with the people of Israel in the Old Testament; biblical lessons relating to idolatry; how one descends into idolatry, how to achieve individual deliverance; and the issues of idolatry in the Christian Church. A path from the bondage of idolatry to the path of freedom in Christ is presented.


COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Participants will be able to:
 - Understand the Covenant Relationship
 - Define idolatry
 - Describe types of idolatry
 - Illustrate the connection of covenant relationships and idolatry to the body, soul, and spirit
 - Distinguish Godly counterbalances to idolatry through living the will of God
 - Devise a new path to freedom from the bondage of idolatry
 - Compare outcomes of the path of bondage to the path of freedom



The word covenant is used throughout the Bible in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. It was first used in God's relationship with Noah. While covenant began with Adam, the word, covenant, is first used in the Old Testament with Noah.

The word, covenant, is described in the Greek and Hebrew by several different words. Words in the Old Testament are in Hebrew and words in the New Testament are in Greek. Almost every word in the Bible is defined by a number. It is good to have a Strong's Concordance to look up biblical word definitions in order to understand what the verse is saying.



The Hebrew meaning of the first usage of the word, Covenant, in the Old Testament means "pledge, agreement, treaty, alliance, relationship". The number of the word is H1285, where H stands for "Hebrew." The Greek meaning of the last usage of the word, Covenant, in the New Testament means "compact, contract, testament, will". The number of the word is G1242, where G stands for "Greek."

If you do not have a Strong's Concordance, you can find the meaning of these words by looking them up in the online Blue Letter Bible, https://www.blueletterbible.org/. Type in the word number and the references in the Bible for that number will display.


6. Look up the Greek word, "ark", G2787, in the Blue Letter Bible. List some of the meanings of this usage of the word, "ark"? (There are several).

7. Read Genesis 6:18; Exodus 2:3; Deuteronomy 31:25-26; 1 Kings 8:6, 10-11; Revelations 11:19

These passages illustrate the word "ARK" is relevant to Noah, Moses, the physical temple, and the heavenly temple. Think about the meanings of the word "ark" in the Hebrew and Greek, what do you think the ark symbolizes and how is it relevant to us?

A BIBLICAL COVENANT IS A RELATIONSHIP WITH AN AGREEMENT TO LIVE ACCORDING TO HIS WILL.

HIS WILL = the testament; the word





Using the words interpreted from the Hebrew (H1285) and Greek (G1242) word, "Covenant", one might say the definition of a biblical covenant is a relationship with Christ with an agreement to live according to his will (the testament; the word).


When we live outside the Will, the Word of God, we are guilty of breaking the covenant. Thank God, He always keeps His end of the covenant. His will, the Word stands and cannot be broken.

Often people ask, "What is God's will for my life?" He

knows our heart and instructs us in Proverbs 4:23 to keep our heart with all diligence, for out of it are the issues of life. We have His will in His Word. In order to stay in relationship with Christ we must follow His will, His Word with our whole heart; thus keeping our end of the Covenant.

Have you ever thought of the Bible as the WILL of God? Many ask, "How do I know God's will for my life?" God speaks His Will to us through His Word, His Testaments, the Bible.

The two testaments (old and new) are covenants which portray the will of God. The new testament fulfilled the old testament, when a new covenant was made through Jesus Christ.

Many people say the Old Testament is no longer relevant. However, the Old Testament is a type, a shadow, of the New better Testament. It is a physical manifestation of the spiritual. The Old Testament presents the spiritual world in a physical realm. We live in the physical realm. Understanding the Old Testament will help us to understand the New Testament.

Matthew 5:17 says Jesus did not come to abolish the Law or the prophets, but to fulfill them. The prophecies and the law of the Old Testament will continue to accomplish the purpose for which it was given. Jesus came to ESTABLISH the Law, meaning he was the example on how to live the law out perfectly without sin. His coming fulfilled many Old Testament prophecies concerning himself. He did not come to destroy the old system but to build on it and make it better. He came to FINISH the Old Covenant and to establish a New and Better Covenant, which incorporated the foundation of the Old Covenant. We are to follow the example of Jesus.

Will, you must be in **Covenant (Partnership)** with God.

It is a tremendous significance that God's written revelation to man is contained in the form of two covenants – Old and New Testament. If we do not understand the concept of covenant, how can we hope to understand the real meaning of God's message to us? (1960, Prince, 38)

When we understand the concept of God's covenant, God's will, God's Word, and live His Will; then we have revelation to His plan and His purpose for our lives.





Covenant Relationship is a partnership with God to accomplish His Will. Partnering with God is not saying, "God if you do this, then I'll do this." "God, if you give me a new house, then I'll serve you." God, if you get me out of here, then I'll read your Word." We must make a decision to partner with God in order to know His Will. His Word, outlines the partnership details that He has set. God sets the "ifs" and the "thens". These are called "conditions (Deuteronomy 7:12; 8:19). Sometimes God will honor our conditions, but there is no obligation for Him to do so. He knows our heart. What do we want more, our will or His will?

All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God. *2 Timothy* 3:16 There is no other book like the Holy Bible. ALL scripture is given by inspiration of God. When we read the Bible. We are reading the Word of God, the Will of God!

TESTAMENT

The covenant relationship with God recognizes that He is our **Father**, our **Friend**, and our **Teacher**.

Knowing what roles God plays in our lives is important to knowing who we are in Him. He is our Father, Friend, and Teacher. We should put No Other Gods in these roles. When we put someone human or something (physical) above God (spiritual) we are exalting another god.


Knowing Jesus as Father, Friend, and Teacher is POWERFUL! However, often we associate our physical relationship experiences with expectations of how our spiritual relationship with God is; when in reality, the Covenant, the Word of God describes our relationship with God, our Father, Friend, and Teacher. It is what He says it is! We are what He says we are!

God is FAMILY. God is a FRIEND. God is a MENTOR. Think about the physical roles you play in life. They may include the following: son, daughter, student, brother, sibling, sister, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, close friend, student, teacher, babysitter, sports player, band member, club member, grandchild, caretaker, employee, member, or neighbor. We also have godly (spiritual) roles. We are God's child, his friend, and his student.

Who we associate with is important. 1 Corinthians 15:33 says, "Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits." When we hang with God, following his WILL (the Word), we are sure to be in good company.

Being in God's family, we carry the NAME of God's family. Our character and lifestyle is associated to His Name. Psalms 23:3 says, "He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake." When we follow His Will (the Word), it will lead us in the paths of righteousness so that we do not tarnish the name of God.

Thankfully the covenant that we have with God provides forgiveness when we repent for straying from the covenant. 1 John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AS FATHER

FATHER

PARENT, GENERATOR, MALE ANCESTOR, FOUNDER, SENIOR, ORIGINATOR, TRANSMITTER, PRINCIPAL, HEAD, CHIEF

Below are a few scriptures describing God as our Father. Father is defined in the Hebrew and Greek as **"parent, generator, male ancestor, founder, senior, originator, transmitter, principal, head, chief"**. Often, we think of God, the Father in the same light as our earthly father. But there is no comparison!

Reference	Verse
Isaiah 64:8	But now, O LORD, You are our Father ; We are the clay , and You our potter ; And all we are the work of Your hand.
Malachi 2:10	Have we not all one Father ? Has not one God created us? Why do we deal treacherously with one another? By profaning the covenant of the fathers?
Matthew 23:9	Do not call anyone on earth your father; for One is your Father , He who is in heaven.
l Corinthians 8:6	For us <i>there is</i> one God, the Father , of whom <i>are</i> all things, and we for Him; and one Lord Jesus Christ, through whom <i>are</i> all things, and through whom we <i>live</i> .

Isaiah says God our Father shapes who we are! Have you ever felt like a broken piece of pottery, with pieces of life scattered about? Often the brokenness comes from our heritage, our sins, and/or victimization. However, we are never broken beyond repair! God, our Father, made us! He is the master potter, and He can restore and repair our life through His Word better than it was before.

Malachi says God, our Father, wants us to treat our brothers and sisters with loyalty and kindness. Father God is like an earthly father in that His will, His covenant, His Word, is profaned or defiled when we are not in unity within the family.

Matthew quotes Jesus who says that we are not to call any other person "father". In other words, we should not elevate any earthly man with a title. This is a caution against pride. We must exalt God the Father above all men. Roman Catholics call their priests "father". This is unbiblical.

Paul says in Corinthians says that we have LIFE through our Father God! We were created for Him and through Him! We have a wonderful heritage! We have a wonderful family! A wonderful future where we will live forever.

Study Questions

We cannot be in a covenant relationship with God if we do not **believe** His covenant, His Word, and **follow** the conditions as set forth. We have the choice if we want to honor and glorify God the Father.


19. Is it difficult for you to identify with God the Father? How does your relationship with God the Father contrast with your relationship with your earthly father?


20. Read John 8:44. Who was Jesus talking to? What do you think this verse means? How does one switch families, away from God, the Father, to the Father, the Devil?



Do you have a circle of friends? There are three circles of friends: close friends, semi-close friends, and distant friends. The number of close friends is small. We tell secrets to our close friends. We trust them totally to look out for us. We share loyalty. Then there are semi-close friends. We tell them some private information, but not everything. We don't totally trust them or possibly we do not feel completely comfortable with them having complete knowledge about our life. Lastly, there are distant friends. Sometimes, they are distant because of geographic locations, personalities, or social status.

Four verses were selected from the Old and New Covenant to illustrate that when we are in a covenant relationship with God, He is our friend. Now, let's look at the role one has in a covenant relationship when God is our friend.



22. Read 1 Chronicles 6:49. What was the role of Moses to God?

23. Looking at Isaiah 41:8, it is important to know that Jacob was the father of the twelve tribes of Israel. Therefore, Jacob was referred to as Israel. What role was Israel to God?

25. There is a popular song, "Friend of God." The lyrics say we are friends of God. However, what does the Covenant in John 18:14 say the condition is to be called a friend of God?

Is God your close Friend? If so, he is your **associate**, **lover**, **companion**, **neighbor**, **fellow-citizen**, **brother**, **a familiar** one to you? If He is our close Friend, than we are His servant, doing as he commands. We turn to Him first.

28. Knit together is a definition of being in covenant relationship with God as Teacher. If we are knit together to someone, we KNOW that person. Read Matthew 22:29 and Psalms 46:10. How do we KNOW God?

Leviticus 10:3	And Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD spoke, saying: 'By those who come near Me, I must be regarded as holy; And before all the people, I must be glorified .' "
Psalms 86:12	[David said], I will praise You, O Lord my God , with all my heart, And I will glorify Your name forevermore.
Matthew 5:16	Let your [Us] light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.
Romans 15:6	That ye [Us] may with one mind and one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It is important to know the purpose of the Covenant relationship. In future lessons we will learn about covenants God made with individuals, such as Moses, David, and us. The Covenant states very clearly the intent God had for the outcome of His covenant, and that is to bring Him glory!



Being in covenant relationship with God positively affects our Body, Soul, and Spirit. 1 Thessalonians 5:23, says, "I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.". The Word separates the three so we can see clearly how each is affected. Hebrews 4:12 says, "For the **word of God (Covenant)** is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of **soul** and **spirit**, and of the joints and marrow (**body**), and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.".
